TOWN COUNCIL VOTES NOT TO SUBSIDISE FREE PARKING IN POYNTON

Following debate and discussions at the public Town Council meeting on the 23rd September 2024, the Town Council voted against subsidising free parking in Poynton. Thank you to all those who responded to the car parking survey; 75% of respondents did not want the precept (council tax) increased to subsidise free car parking at the civic hall car park.



The Town Council remain opposed to the introduction of car parking charges by Cheshire East Council and the impact these might have on the Town. However, the Cheshire East Council request for £68,861 per annum from the Town Council, increasing the precept for this item alone by over 18%, is excessive and unaffordable for residents.

CHESHIRE EAST COUNCIL VOTE TO PERMANENTLY CLOSE THREE HOUSEHOLD WASTE AND RECYCLING CENTRES

Cheshire East's Environment and Communities committee voted on the 26th September to permanently close the three Household Waste Recycling Sites at Poynton, Bollington and Middlewich.

Despite admissions that the "20 minute journey times" to the Macclesfield site quoted in the report were wrong and fly tipping figures only included waste dumped on their own land the proposals to close the sites were approved by Cheshire East Council by 8 votes to 5.

Poynton, Bollington and surrounding Parishes continue discussions to explore solutions, but Cheshire East are clearly not interested in trying to save the two sites.
